Get up close and personal with one of the richest collections of 19th and 20th-century decorative art in America at Kirkland Museum of Fine & Decorative Art. From Aestheticism to Arts & Crafts to Art Nouveau, join our guest instructor, decorative arts historian Fern Prosnitz, for a weekend seminar on international and American decorative arts from the turn of the 20th century. Beginning with the earliest objects in the collections at this unique, salon-styled museum, we'll explore the evolution of design, the revolutions in taste and style, and the artistic, cultural, social and economic catalysts that provoked the intense bursts of creativity that characterize the decorative arts of Europe and America during the period known as the Gilded Age or the Belle Epoque. Highlights include a tour of the collections with the Kirkland's director and curator Hugh Grant, an evening reception at the museum, dinner as a group at the Avenue Grill and, for those electing the one-day extension on Saturday, a field trip to Colorado Springs to trace the origins of the Van Briggie Pottery, Colorado's most important participant in the American Art Pottery movement, still in operation today.

Kirkland Museum of Fine & Decorative Art is partly housed in a carefully preserved Arts & Crafts building dating from 1910-11. The Museum's collections now exceed 10,000 objects with over 3,300 currently on display.
